Upcoming at the Village School

Friday November 7 Lantern Walk Children bring homemade lanterns and gather around the bonfire at the school at 5:00. We all join in singing, storytelling, then we walk to the Town Hall with the lanterns lighting the way. The Village School Building

A lot was accomplished this summer at Camp Caravan. Beginning with a very wet site, we cleared trees, pulled and ground stumps for a wetland barrier, and excavated much of the site. We brought in construction cloth, gravel, and sand to promote drainage. We have a huge pile of topsoil waiting for the day when it can be spread across the playground for the future landscaping. Our boulders from the excavation (a great New England feature) will be reintegrated into the landscape where the Sugar maples still stand giving shade and beauty.

We've created rough driveways and parking areas and the well, approved as a public water supply with good water, is now in. We've prepared the foundation area and it's now ready for pouring. Come by and see the site. The construction sand delineates each area for a crystal clear, inspiring view.

The Village School received a \$9,000 grant from the North Central Development Corp. for some of the logging and milling. Group member Stefan Maier organized a very special practical work project for our Summer Seminar week using the trees cleared from the site. We all helped with milling the pine and oak from the property into lumber. It felt wonderful to take it to this next stage, harvesting 6,200 board feet under cover and drying for future use.

We are in the permitting project for all the systems for the new building. We have raised around \$600,000 and are working hard at raising more, in order to get the next phase done, pouring the foundation and building a weatherproof shell.

The following is from a talk by Mr. Bennett, *The Future: What is our Responsibility?* dated June 10, 1974 and an inspiration for the founding of The Village School twenty years ago:

As I said before, the external form and particularly the kind of material environment depends upon the needs of the people. If a temple were to be built it would not be for the sake of having a temple, but because the time had come when the society would be able to worship in its own way. If a school was made it would be because the children of that society would require to have the possibility of being taught on psychokinetic principles. One of the things that for many years I've inwardly grieved about is that we've never been able to undertake this because we've never had the resources and we've never had sufficient stability and continuity. Children's schools based on psychokinetic principles are in existence, for example, Rudolf Steiner schools, but they are not in general associated with the rest of society.

Mr. Bennett's vision is coming into reality. By providing a permanent home for the Village School, we provide the stability for the school to thrive, hopefully for generations. The task is huge, and we will only see a short piece of the result. But even now, seeing Village School graduates move on to college with confidence, and compassion, has been very rewarding. What could be more valuable than to provide a common sense meaningful education for children in today's crazy world ?
