Women's Movements with Margit

In July a group of us gathered at Camp Caravan for Movements practice under the guidance of Margit Martinu.

After allowing the experience to settle, several of us felt a persistent wish to deepen our experience with Movements with regular and intensive practice. In this direction, Margit is willing to provide guidance on principles and practices for teaching Movements, and to lead sessions. She writes,

"In general I see the point of working with the Movements is very much related to transmission-meaning that we need a great deal of knowledge to be able to transmit them in a correct way to ensure their continuity in the future. For this, long training and deep understanding of the Work that is encoded in them is necessary in order to keep the Movements from degenerating (which is today happening very fast all over the world) and to keep them on the right level.

I feel a whole new vision of this Work is needed and this is what I am engaged in. Movements are a means, not an end in themselves. "

The model we are considering involves periodic intensives of up to a week of work with Margit, with regular weekend gatherings of students to practice, integrate, and deepen with a rotating group of teachers from within the group, at Camp Caravan or other locales in the northeast. We aim to begin in the fall of 2011.

The Dramatic Universe Conference

The twenty-five participants came together with the purpose of engaging substantively with the unique material of The Dramatic Universe, with a balance between the program of lectures and informal meetings. Henri Bortoft gave an astonishing talk entitled, Hyparxis and the Dynamics of Being, and Tony Hodgson gave a beautifully clear presentation of practical Systematics (as well as giving us an impromptu clarinet solo), in addition to six other talks. Many who admitted to initial skepticism later reported that they had been surprised at the effectiveness and creativity of the overall event, and felt energized and inspired to further study and work. The consensus is that there should be follow-up conferences.
